TRANSPORTATION LISTENING SESSION

PLANNING AND ZONING



The Town of Oakland has developed a proposed new and modern Zoning Code.

The code would regulate a full range of land development including but not limited to: design, subdivision platting, permitted uses in each zoning district, standards, lots, parking, landscape, traffic, tree protection, fences, lighting, signs, and more.

The Town Commission will begin hosting public meetings on the topic March 10 with the ordinance scheduled for adoption on April 14.

PUBLIC WORKS

The Town operates four sanitary sewer pumping stations, approximately five miles of gravity sewer and an additional three miles of forcemain, or pressurized sewer. Keeping this system operating smoothly 24/7 is no easy task.

In 2011, the Town began working toward the elimination of septic systems as new development began. Once Oakland secured a treatment provider, the City of Clermont, we could begin moving forward with the plan.

Today, we currently have approximately 450 customers and another 500 permitted for sewer connection. Additionally, the Town Commission has developed policy that requires all new developments connect to the central sewer system. This allows for developers to partner with the town, at their expense, in constructing the sewer system.

Combined with the \$2.45 million in financial assistance Oakland has received from the State Legislature in recent years, the Town has essentially leveraged its money to further this initiative.

Other nearly finished sewer related projects include the construction of a septic system for the Healthy West Orange Arts and Heritage Center at the Town of Oakland, the installation of a telemetry system at our primary lift station which will relay data to the City of Clermont; and the construction of a regional lift station on Hull Island Drive near Lake Apopka.

OAKLAND NATURE PRESERVE
