With an increasingly elderly population, serious injuries and deaths resulting from falls or other incapacitating conditions have been on the increase. Many of these incidents could have been prevented if the victim could have contacted someone by phone or some other means. The “I’ve fallen and can’t get up” scenario is a real one, which is worthy of serious scrutiny by public safety officials.

In an effort to prevent these tragic incidents from occurring here in Oakland, the Oakland Police Department has developed a well-being check program entitled Oakland Partners. It calls for daily contact between the resident and Police Department. If contact isn’t made by phone, an officer responds to the home of the Oakland Partner to check on their well-being.

The Oakland Partners program provides a measure of safety and security to those who need it most and the Oakland Police Department is proud to offer this service to our elderly residents.

Once completed, the form needs to be submitted to the department, along with a house key. From then on, the Oakland Partner need only call the designated phone line each day between 8:30 a.m. and 12 noon to check in.
