On January 25, 2022, the transportation sales tax referendum effort was re-launched after a nearly two-year hiatus due to the COVID 19 pandemic crisis. The residents of Orange County are in the driver's seat, setting the direction of transportation policy as to where we're going and how we'll get there.

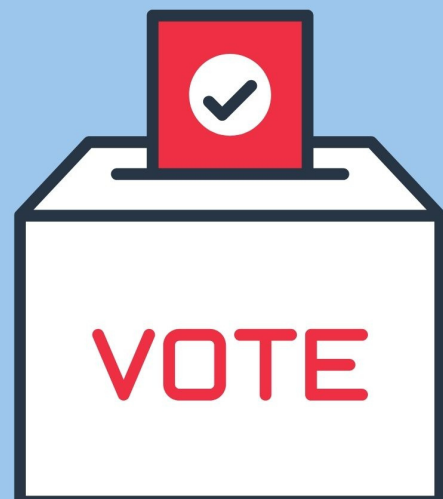
MUNICIPAL ELECTION IS MARCH 8

Oakland's Municipal Election will take place on March 8, 2022. Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. at Oakland Presbyterian Church, located at 218 E. Oakland Ave.

- Seat #4 - Town Commission member Joseph McMullen (Seat 4) has qualified and is unopposed. Commissioner McMullen will serve an additional four-year term.
- Seat #1 - The Town of Oakland will have a Municipal Election in 2022 for Commission Seat #1. Candidates for Seat #1 are as follows:
 - Rick Polland (Incumbent)
 - Matthew Bunevich

On Election Day, you must vote at your assigned polling place. You must also bring photo and signature identification. If you need help in reading or marking your ballot, you may bring someone with you, or poll workers are available to assist. Spanish language assistance and ADA-compliant voting equipment are available at all polling places.
